No dogs will be allowed in livestock or show areas!

\*\*\*\*\*IMPORTANT NOTICES\*\*\*\*

\*BE SURE TO ENTER YOUR EXHIBIT IN THE CORRECT LOT AND ENTER THE CORRECT BIRTHDATE! If you do not include a birthdate with your breeding animal entries it will be considered to be January 1 of appropriate year. To make changes at check in the animal will have to be entered as an 'Entry Day of show' entry and pay the appropriate fees. All signatures and entry fees are required with entry!

\*Futurity Beef, Futurity Breeding Heifers and Open Market Beef check in Tuesday 4PM-6PM then show Wednesday morning with Ultra sounding of ALL Futurity animals immediately following the show.

All other livestock can register Tuesday October 7<sup>th</sup> from 4pm to 6pm and Wednesday October 8<sup>th</sup> from 8am to 6pm at the WJLS Office in the Lions Building

\*Swine is checked in 8am - 9am on Wednesday. Show at noon Wednesday

# GENERAL SHOW RULES INTERPRETATION OF THESE RULES:

The WJLS executive committee, by authority of the WJLS Board of Directors, has the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, violations, complaints and questions or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, or connected with, or incidental to the show. They can and will enforce these rules and regulations at all times. The Board of Directors and/or executive committee reserves the right to bar from future shows any exhibitor who knowingly violates any of the WJLS rules. They have the right to bar from future shows, any exhibitor found to have performed any artificial or fraudulent practice. The penalty is forfeiture of all privileges and the possibility of being barred from future shows.

In all cases the Executive Committee, with the approval of the WJLS Board of Directors, reserves the right to accept or reject any entry conditionally, as it is intended that only animals of sufficient merit will be accepted. The Board of Directors may appoint a special committee to inspect and screen entries as they arrive on registration day. This committee may recommend that animals that are in any way objectionable or lacking merit should not be exhibited. If any animal is refused admittance by the show management, there will be an entry fee refund.

#### **2025 ENTRY FORMS**

Make sure that ALL the information is correct. Signatures and fees must accompany entry! If your animal is entered in the wrong lot or has wrong birthdate you will be eligible to show the animal by paying the 'Entry Day of Show' fee. Changes of lots, breed classification and birthdates will only be permitted at registration by paying the 'Entry Day of Show fee= Entry forms can be obtained from, the WJLS Show Manager or on the WJLS web site (www.westernjuniorlivestockshow@gmail.com). Please make sure that you are using a 2025 entry form and all the information that you put on the entry blank is complete, legible, and that you have entered everything in the right lot number (Lot numbers may change from year to year, always check). Check which age group you are in and which showmanship contests you plan to enter. Please read the livestock sale rules and mark the entry blank correctly.

#### DRESS CODE for entire show will be enforced!

All exhibitors <u>MUST</u> wear a **long or short sleeve shirt/blouse** <u>WITH A COLLAR</u> of any color. No shirts or caps with logos or printing except for the WJLS logo. Full-length jeans or pants, **hard\_soled shoes or boots** with closed toes. Exhibitor numbers must be worn in clear view.

#### **CODE OF ETHICS**

The Western Junior Livestock Show expects all exhibitors and their families to abide by the Code of Ethics and all Rules and Regulations printed in this book. **Each exhibitor is responsible for making themselves familiar with all rules.** Violation of rules will lead to forfeiture of awards and auction proceeds, expulsion from the show and will be prohibited from future shows

- \*Exhibitors, family members and any absolute responsible person shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship.
- \*Youth and their family members are expected to care for and groom their animals while at the WJLS. If an exhibitor while showing in any part of the WJLS violates any rules or guidelines, that exhibitor will receive a verbal warning. A second infraction will cause the exhibitor to be dismissed from the class.

- \*Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and /or absolute responsible person for show management to ask a licensed Veterinarian to obtain specimens of urine, saliva, blood or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Livestock shall not be exhibited if drug, (allowable by Federal or State statutes) affects the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the specimen results indicate the presence of forbidden drugs or medications, this shall be grounds for expulsion from the show.
- \*Any surgical procedure or injection or any external application of any substance which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearances is prohibited.
- \*The use of showing and/or handling practices of devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical device or other practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- \*Direct criticism or interference with the judge, show manager, director or show officers and /or other exhibitor before, during or after the competition is prohibited.
- \*The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, or absolute responsible person whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in breaking of the code of ethics.
- \*The act of entering an animal is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, or absolute responsible person that he or she has read the WJLS code of ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided in the code.

#### **ARTIFICIAL PRACTICES**

The Board of Directors has the right to disqualify any animal whose appearance has been materially changed or altered by any process, including dying of the hair, which may make breed determination and classification difficult or uncertain. Any pre-show injection or any compound that may cause a quantitative or qualitative change in the characteristics of an animal on foot or in the carcass may also result in disqualification. Any animal, on which any surgical operation has been performed, with the exception of dehorning, to improve the animal's appearance, may also be disqualified. Tail docking for lambs is a normal management practice in newborn lambs, however, it is unacceptable to dock lambs by any method including surgical removal of tail tissue or bone.

#### **PENALTY**

If the exhibitor while showing in the show violates a rule or guideline, the exhibitor will be given a verbal warning. If the same exhibitor violates the rules or guidelines a second time, he/she will be dismissed from the show ring for that class.

The Board of Directors and/or executive committee reserves the right to bar from future shows any exhibitor who knowingly violates any of the WJLS rules. They have the right to bar from future shows, any exhibitor found to have performed any artificial or fraudulent practice. The penalty is forfeiture of all privileges and the possibility of being barred from future shows

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO EXHIBIT?

Any youth, without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, or place of residence who is 8 years old and not more than 18 years of age by January 1<sup>st</sup> of the current (2025) calendar year.

#### **EXHIBITOR REQUIREMENTS**

Class specifications are included in each project section of these rules. Fitting, clipping and blocking etc., of livestock exhibits while on the Western Junior Livestock Show grounds will be performed only by the youth, or a member of the immediate family. The exhibitor should be present while such fitting is being done.

#### **OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS**

The <u>exhibitor must own</u> all livestock entered into the show. Ownership of the following methods is acceptable. (1) Completely owned by the exhibitor; (2) Exhibitor and Parents; (3) Exhibitor, brothers, sisters and /or brother-sister ownership.

#### NUMBER OF ENTRIES ONE EXHIBITOR MAY ENTER

There is no limit on livestock entries. A futurity animal that was entered at the previous show must still pay the appropriate entry fee. An animal can only be entered in one lot. (Futurity Heifers cannot be shown in the regular breeding classes). One exhibit per lot number for the non-livestock entries. Non-livestock entries are Range Management, Entomology, Forestry or Wool.

#### **SHOWING**

All livestock must be exhibited in the show-ring by the exhibitor or by another youth. Substitute showmen must wear the exhibitor number of the youth who entered the animal

#### **SUBSTUTIONS**

**Substitutions within the same species will be allowed until September 25, 2025**. After September 25, 2025 you will have to enter it as "Entry Day of Show' and pay the appropriate fee. After September 25<sup>th</sup> the only substitutions that will be accepted are natural death or severe injury accompanied by a veterinary certificate. No refunds to "No-Shows". A change of a lot, birthdate or breed classification is considered a change of animal/entry.

#### **HEALTH CERTIFICATES**

All livestock must be accompanied with an official health certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian <u>issued within 30 days</u> of entry to the show <u>with Western Junior Livestock Show name as destination</u>. Animals not having a health certificate may not be brought on the grounds.

ALL Livestock includes BEEF, DAIRY CATTLE, WOOL SHEEP, MEAT SHEEP, SWINE, MEAT GOAT and DAIRY GOAT. Health certificates must comply with the South Dakota Animal Health Requirements. (South Dakota Animal Industry Board's phone number is 605-773-3321). Health Certificate should include the name and address of exhibitor, age, sex and breed of livestock, test results, and signature, address and phone number of inspecting licensed and accredited veterinarian. All sheep and goats must have the scrapies tags in their ear before they will be allowed to check in. To order official scrapies tags, please contact the State Veterinarian, South Dakota Animal Industry Board, 411 S Fort Street, Pierre, SD 57501. Phone 605-773-3321 Fax 605-773-5459.

#### **Brand Inspection**

It is your responsibility to have the correct paperwork. Check with the South Dakota Brand Board, http://www.sdbrandboard.com /as to what is needed to attend the show and for what you need to return home with cattle from the show. All Futurity Market Beef need a brand inspection even if it does not have a brand. Cattle with no brands still need brand inspection paperwork.

#### WHERE TO BRING ENTRIES

(Two-step Process)

The Central States Fair Grounds is located at 800 San Francisco Street, Rapid City, South Dakota.

- \*\*\*Step 1: All livestock must be **registered** with proper health papers at the WJLS office in the Lyon's Building before they can be checked in. At registration your entries will be verified, and you will receive your exhibitor number.
- \*\*\* Step 2: From registration you will proceed to check in. All beef animals will be ear tagged. Feeder calves, Futurity animals and Market animals will be weighed. All Market Swine, Lambs and Goats will be weighed, and ear tagged. Breeding sheep and Breeding meat goats and Dairy Goats must be checked in, and their scrapies tag number recorded. All Market Swine will be weighed, and ear tagged. Breeding swine will be ear tagged.

#### **CHECK THE SCHEDULE ON PAGE 2 FOR CHECK IN TIMES**

- \*Futurity Beef, Futurity Heifer and Open Market Beef must enter Tuesday, October 7 4PM-6PM.
- \*All remaining livestock exhibits must be registered at the office on Tuesday, October 7, 2025 4PM-6PM or Wednesday, October 8, 2025 8:00am to 6:00pm at the WJLS office in the Lions Building on the Central States Fair Grounds. Animals will be checked in at appropriate stations 1PM-6PM.
- \*Swine check in 8am-9am Wednesday, Show at noon Wednesday, October 9th.
- \*Non-livestock exhibits accepted between 9 am and 6 pm in the designated area of the Nerdy Nuts Expo Center Wednesday, October 8, 2025.

#### ENTRY CHECK IN ~ Check in is a two-step process

<u>Failure</u> on the part of an exhibitor to properly complete the check in procedure will result in those animals being deleted from the show records and not eligible to show! Only livestock officially entered in the show may be housed in the barns!

**Step 1:** <u>REGISTER</u> at the WJLS office in the Lion's Building with health papers. This is where you will verify entries and receive you back tag number.

**Step 2:** After registering livestock at the WJLS office, exhibitors must take their back tag along with their livestock to the respective <u>CHECK IN</u> areas where the animal will receive an ear tag. (Breeding sheep, Breeding Meat Goats and Dairy Goats will use the scrapies tag number, but **must still be checked in.)** <u>All sheep and goats must have the scrapies tags in their ear before they will be allowed to check in.</u> All **market/feeder livestock will be weighed** on an official scale only once and that weight will be documented.

#### CHECK IN AREAS ~ Will be posted at the show

Livestock will be weighed and/or ear tagged at check in areas as follows:

- \*Futurity Beef, Futurity Heifers & Open Market Beef Location to be posted
- \*Feeder Calves at the scale on the Southwest corner of the Nerdy Nuts Expo Center
- \*Breeding Beef Location to be posted
- \*Sheep and Goats Breeding sheep and Breeding Goats and Dairy Goats will check in at a different area than Market Sheep and Market Goats. Locations to be posted
- \*Swine Location to be posted.

#### **STALLING**

1<sup>st</sup> come 1<sup>st</sup> served. You pick your spot. Sheep & Goats will be housed in Barns 7 & 8 with swine housed in Barn 9

#### **CAMPERS**

If you want to camp during WJLS please contact Central States Fair at 605-355-3861.

#### **WASH RACK**

Wash rack space is available for washing of livestock. Animals must be washed only at the wash rack.

#### WOOD CHIPS, WOOD SHAVINGS

Exhibitors must use only wood chips or wood shavings for bedding material. No wood chips or shavings of any type will be available on the grounds.

#### **HERDSMANSHIP**

Livestock Exhibitors are expected to keep their livestock in assigned stall space and have it neat and clean at all times. All refuse matter must be disposed of in the places designated. Animals are to be housed in their designated area. All stalls must be cleaned and all refuse must be placed in designated areas outside of the barns before you leave for home.

#### TACK BOXES, FEED AND EQUIPMENT

Feed and equipment should be placed so that it does not block the alley. Fitting chutes and blocking stands will not be permitted in alleys, and they will not be permitted on the grounds unless the fee has been paid and the chute has a current year registration tag on it. If the current year tag is not on a chute the Grounds Committee can and will ask for that chute fees paid or removed!! If you will be using a generator, please be considerate in keeping the noise level down near show ring areas.

#### **EXHIBIT RELEASE TIME**

Livestock exhibits not entered in the LIVESTOCK SALE will be released when they have completed showing. **Stalls must be cleaned before you leave.** Non-livestock exhibits will be released at 6:00 pm on Friday, October 10, 2025.

#### **WJLS LIVESTOCK SALE**

Exhibitors wishing to market their livestock at the WJLS sale <u>PLEASE DESIGNATE ON THE ENTRY IF THE ANIMAL IS FOR SALE</u>. An animal smarked 'for sale' must go through the sale. An animal that is marked 'no sale' may change to 'for sale' at registration. An exhibitor, parent, or other person will have the privilege to "Buy Back" livestock consigned to the auction, but a declaration of "No Sale" will not be permitted in the sale ring.

\*\*FUTURITY BEEF ANIMALS will be scanned by ultrasound methods for carcass merits after the live show. ‡

All futurity beef animals will be sold at auction. A preview of sale cattle will be held Saturday 12 noon -2

pm in Barn 9. Futurity Breeding Heifers will not be offered for sale.

\*\*No Breeding animals EXCEPT Swine, Junior Heifer calves (born in 2025), ewe lambs (born in 2025) and Junior meat goat does (born in 2025) will be sold. Any swine weighing over 325 pounds cannot be sold. Animals failing to show in the ring may not go through the sale!!

All livestock will be sold by the head, but the check in weight will be available to potential buyers. All beef, sheep, swine and goat animals eligible for sale must be accompanied at check in with a proper bill of sale. This includes branded and non-branded cattle. Lot 29 Open Market Beef are not eligible to sell.

#### **COMMISSION**

A sale commission of 2 ½ percent of the selling price of any livestock sold through the auction will be charged and deducted from the exhibitor's payment. The \$1.00 per head "Beef Check Off" will be deducted on all beef animals sold.

#### SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST

#### **DRESS CODE will be enforced!**

All exhibitors <u>MUST</u> wear a **long or short sleeve shirt/blouse** <u>WITH A COLLAR</u> of any color. No shirts or caps with logos or printing except for the WJLS logo. Full-length jeans or pants, **shoes or boots** with closed toes. Exhibitor numbers must be worn in clear view. Failure to do so will result in expulsion from the showmanship contest.

#### \*Note\* the Gate-cut method will be used

Beginner Age 8, 9 or 10 as of January 1, 2025 (current year) Junior: Age 11, 12 or 13 as of January 1, 2025 (current year) Senior: Age 14, 15, 16, 17 or 18 as of January 1, 2025 (current year) If an exhibitor while showing in any part of the WJLS violates any rules or guidelines, that exhibitor will receive a verbal warning. A second infraction will cause the exhibitor to be dismissed from the class. Exhibitors wishing to compete in any showmanship contest should sign up on the entry blank in the space provided, youth may not elect to enter JUST showmanship. All animals used in showmanship must be owned by the exhibitor and must be entered and shown in its appropriate class in the show. Ear tag numbers will be checked. There will be showmanship contests for Beef, Wool Sheep, Meat Sheep, Dairy Cattle, Swine, Meat Goat and Dairy Goat. Please check the show schedule for date and time of the contest. Beef, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Meat Goats, Wool Sheep, Meat Sheep and Swine Showmanship contests will use the "Gate-Cut" method. Order will be Senior, Junior then Beginner. The first 8-12 (appropriate number for area being used) will be allowed into the ring as the First Heat. The class will be judged, purple ribbon showmen will be selected to return for the final drive, and the class will be excused. All subsequent heats will follow the same process. The show's Committee Chair will determine the number of heats to be judged for each age division and make a final call from the show ring no less than 3 times to announce the final heat, allowing all exhibitors equal opportunity to participate.

#### **MISSION STATEMENT**

The Western Junior Livestock Show is a volunteer-based youth organization to help young people become self-reliant, productive, contributing members of the agricultural industry.

#### **PURPOSE OF THE SHOW**

The Western Junior Livestock Show was organized in 1937 and has been an annual event since. The first show included only the feeder calf project but since that time the show has grown to include sheep, swine, dairy, dairy goats, meat goats and other projects relating to livestock production. The show was developed as an agriculture youth show to serve as a show window for the livestock industry to set a standard of type and quality, which serves as a guide to every interested producer and provide a competitive outlet for youth livestock projects.

#### **FUTURE SHOW DATES**

Future show dates will be posted on the WJLS web site. The 2026 Western Junior Livestock Show dates are October 6-10, 2026. (Always the **first full week in October**)

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

WJLS is a non-profit membership organization existing on the revenues from membership money. There are changes to the membership qualifications to Western Junior Livestock Show per the revised bylaws that took effect at the annual meeting held in 2019.

<u>Section 1</u>. **QUALIFICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP:** Members in this corporation shall consist of individuals or groups interested in supporting the Western Junior Livestock Show (WJLS) who have purchased an annual membership in the corporation for the current year.

There shall be two categories of members:

- 1) A Member shall be an individual person eight years of age or older having paid the annual dues. A member fourteen years of age or older is entitled to one vote.
- 2) An Associate Member shall be an individual or entity having paid the annual dues as designated by the board of directors, but shall not be a voting member.

<u>Section 2</u>. **TERM OF MEMBERSHIP**: All memberships shall be for the annual term from August 1st to July 31st.

**Section 3. COST OF MEMBERSHIP**: The annual membership fee for a member shall be FIVE DOLLARS (\$5.00). The annual membership fee for an associate membership shall be recommended by the Board of Directors and proposed at the annual membership meeting for the following membership term.

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

Per revised by laws:

**SECTION 1. QUALIFICATIONS**: The Board of Directors shall consist of 13 members elected by the entire membership in attendance at the annual meeting. Directors must be voting members of the association, and reside in the region(s) represented. One director shall be elected from regions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, an 8. Two directors shall be elected from regions 6 and 7. In addition, three directors (youth directors) shall be elected who are 15, but not more than 18, years of age at the time of election: one from regions 1, 4, and 5: one from regions 2 and 3; and one from regions 6, 7, and 8.

Region 1: Harding, Perkins, Corson, Butte, Lawrence, Meade, Ziebach, and Dewey Counties

Region 2: Pennington County

Region 3: Custer, Fall River and Oglala Lakota Counties

Region 4: Haakon, Stanley, Jackson, Jones Lyman Counties

Region 5: Bennett, Mellette, Todd, Tripp and Gregory Counties

Region 6: Campbell, Walworth, McPherson, Edmunds, Brown, Marshall, Day, Roberts, Beadle, Hand, Hyde, Sully, Hughes Counties

Region 7: Buffalo, Jerauld, Sanborn, Miner, Lake, Moody, Brule, Aurora, Davison, Hanson, McCook, Minnehaha, Charles Mix, Douglas, Hutchinson, Turner, Lincoln, Bob Homme, Yankton, Clay and Union Counties

Region 8: Out of State – to include all members residing outside of the boundaries of the State of South Dakota.

SECTION 2. ELECTION OF DIRECTORS: A Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the Board of Directors and contain at least (3) previous chairs of the organization. The Nominating Committee is tasked with recruiting and presenting to the annual membership meeting, a ballot of qualified candidates for each open position. The nominating committee may nominate any voting member and shall nominate at least one person for each open seat and publish the nominees at the show. Any voting member shall be placed on the ballot for consideration by presenting a petition containing the name and signature of 20 voting members to the nominating committee no later than October 20. The slate of candidates placed on the ballot either by nominating committee or by petition shall be included in the official notice of the Annual Membership meeting.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> TERMS OF DIRECTORS AND VACANCIES: Each director elected shall serve for a term of 3 years, except the youth directors shall be elected be elected annually. A director may serve no more than two, full consecutive three-year terms. Youth directors may serve not more than three terms. A vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Board of Directors, for the remainder of the term by any member from the region represented.

**Director's terms that are expiring in 2025 are** Regions 1, 4, 6, 7 and all Youth Directors and non-voting directors.

#### **MEETING DATE**

Per the WJLS by-laws, 'The annual meeting of the members shall be held in the months of November or December following the show, date to be set by the Executive Committee.' The annual directors meeting follows the membership meeting.

#### **Awards**

If you receive an award, please pick it up at the show as **awards will not be sent and they will be forfeited.** You can arrange for someone to pick it up for you.

#### **INCENTIVE PREMIUMS**

Cash incentive premiums will be awarded to animals in classes that have sponsorships. A complete listing of incentive awards and award sponsors are available upon request or in the annual show book. If you are awarded a premium from a home town (local) sponsor, bring the money with you. Please turn it into the WJLS Office and WJLS will recognize the donor and you will receive a check from WJLS for the amount of the premium.

#### **Top 5 Awards**

A Top 5 Award will be awarded in each of the following categories. The First-place purple ribbon animal in each lot is eligible to compete for Champion (1<sup>st</sup> Place), the Second-place purple ribbon from the lot the Champion's represents will be eligible to compete for 2<sup>nd</sup> thru 5<sup>th</sup> place along with the rest of the 1<sup>st</sup> place animals.

#### **BREED CLASSIFICATION**

PUREBRED ANIMALS-An animal that meets breed association blood percentage requirements for registration in that particular breed association. Must meet requirements for registration, not just recording.

GRADE ANIMALS-An animal that has the same breed qualifications as the registered animal but is not registered. The animal must meet the same blood percentage as that required by breed associations for registration.

CROSSBRED ANIMALS-An animal of mixed breed that does not meet any breed association requirements for registration. Space is available on the official entry blank for listing the breed of sire and dam of all animals. Please furnish this information as accurately as possible. Intentional misrepresentation of breed classification can cause an exhibitor to be expelled from the show.

#### **MARKET BEEF CATTLE**

**Either steers or heifers** are eligible to compete in the open market beef classes. Heifers and steers will compete in the same class. All animals will be shown at halter. The classes will be determined by weight categories.

There will be no weight limits on Lot 29 Open Market Beef animals. Animals exhibited in Lot 29 WILL NOT be slaughtered and will not be sold at the sale. There is no county group of three in this lot.

LOT 30: WJLS BEEF CARCASS FUTURITY: These animals will be mandatory clipped for ultrasound purposes after they have been shown. These animals will not be slaughtered. Either steers or heifers are eligible to compete in the futurity show. Heifers and steers will compete in the same class. An exhibitor may show more than one futurity beef animal. Any futurity beef animal weighing less than 1200 pounds or more than 1550 pounds will not be eligible for the futurity show. If your futurity animal does not meet these weight requirements, it will be moved to the Open Market Lot with permission from the WJLS Executive Committee.

Futurity beef must have been entered and exhibited as a feeder calf at the previous year WJLS. The youth/buyer must enter the calf in the Futurity competition within one hour following the sale the year the calf is exhibited. All entries will be hot iron marked with a special WJLS iron by the Futurity Committee when entered. Entry fees in the Futurity will be Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) per animal. Animals that have been entered in the futurity may be sold, but the manager needs to be notified before March 15, 2026 by the seller with the new owner's name, address and the ID of the animal. There is no county group of three in this lot.

LOT 31: WJLS BREEDING HEIFER FUTURITY: <u>These animals will be mandatory clipped for ultrasound</u> <u>purposes after they have been shown.</u> To be eligible for the futurity the heifer must have been entered and exhibited as a Junior Heifer Calf or Feeder Heifer Calf at the previous year WJLS and have been bangs vaccinated. The youth/buyer must enter the calf in the futurity competition within one (1) hour following

the close of the sale the year the calf is exhibited. All entries will be identified by the WJLS Futurity Heifer committee when entered. Entry fees in the Futurity Heifer Show will be Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) per animal. An exhibitor may enter more than 1 animal. Heifers that have been entered in the futurity may be sold, but the manager needs to be notified before May 31, 2026 by the seller with the new owner's name, address and the ID of the heifer. Prizes will be awarded. All futurity breeding heifers will be pregnancy checked at the show and must be bred. Futurity Breeding Heifers will not be permitted to show in regular breeding classes unless they are pregnancy tested open at the show. If they test open, they will be entered in the appropriate breeding heifer class at the show by the committee. It is recommended that the Futurity Heifers be pregnancy checked at the time the health certificate is obtained.

A Junior Heifer calf may be purchased at the Black Hills Stock Show by a youth, then entered into the WJLS Futurity Breeding class by notifying the Manager of the purchase with complete ID details of the purchased Junior Heifer calf by March 15<sup>th</sup> of current year and paying the \$30 fee.

#### BREEDING BEEF

Junior heifer calves may be sold. No other breeding beef may be sold.

## BREED CLASSIFICATION AND THE ANIMALS BIRTHDATE MUST BE INCLUDED ON THE ENTRY BLANK. If birthdate is not included it will be entered as January 1 of appropriate year.

Heifers entered in the Breeding Beef classes may be purebred, grade or crossbred from any of the recognized beef breeds.

BULL CALVES must be purebred and registered or eligibility for registry, must be present at time of check in. BULL CALVES must be at least 1/2 blood of the breed class entered.

#### **Judging Contest Rules**

Every contestant in the Livestock Judging Contest is expected to follow the instructions given by the superintendent of the judging contest and by their respective group leaders. Every contestant should provide themselves with pencil and card for taking notes.

<u>Every contestant in the livestock judging contest must do his or her own judging</u>. Any conference with other contestants or with anyone else, except the group leader, will be considered a violation of this rule and the CONTESTANT WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

All contestants in the Senior and Junior divisions are permitted to take notes on their placing for the purpose of developing a set of reasons. All contestants in both divisions will give their reasons WITHOUT USING NOTES. **Contestants on judging teams may not cross over into a different age group or county.** LIVESTOCK TO BE JUDGED: If stock is available classes may be from these classes: Breeding Cattle, Market Cattle, Breeding Sheep, Market Sheep, Breeding Swine, Market Swine, Breeding Meat Goats, Market Meat Goats, Dairy Goats, and Wool.

RULES ON TIE BREAKING: If ties occur within the first five places of any of the contest, the tie will be broken in favor of the individual or team having the highest total reasons scores. If reason scores are equal between the tying parties, contestants will be required to give an additional set of reasons to the contest co-chairman and their scores will determine the winner.

#### **BEGINNERS LIVESTOCK JUDGING CONTEST**

The Junior Livestock judging contest is open to all youth that are 11 years of age and less than 14 years of age on January 1, 2025 (Ages 11, 12 and 13). All juniors not registered as members of a county team may judge as individuals. Six classes will be judged and one set of oral reasons will be given.

#### JUNIOR LIVESTOCK JUDGING TEAM CONTEST

Any county may enter a Junior Livestock judging team in the contest. A team shall consist of at least three (3) and not more than four (4) members from **their county**. All team members shall have been 11 years of age and less than 14 years of age on January 1, 2025. The total of the three highest scores will be used as the team score.

#### SENIOR LIVESTOCK JUDGING CONTEST

The Senior Livestock judging contest is open to all youth that are 14 years of age and less than 19 years of age on January 1, 2025. All senior who are not registered members of a county team may judge as individuals. Six classes of livestock will be judged and two sets of oral reasons will be given.

#### SENIOR LIVESTOCK JUDGING TEAM CONTEST

Any county may enter a Senior team in the contest. A team shall consist of at least three (3) and not more than four (4) members from **their county**. All team members shall be 14 years of age and less than 19 years of age on January 1, 2025. The total of the three highest scores will be used as the team score.

#### FFA LIVESTOCK JUDGING CONTEST

FFA members may judge individually or may judge in a group under the supervision of their instructor but shall not compete for WJLS awards. All contestants must register at the time and place designated in the show schedule.

#### **MEATS IDENTIFICATION CONTEST**
